• We almost always use the contraction didn't in speech and informal writing.

Spelling rules for regular verbs

- For most verbs, add -ed to the base form. enjoy \rightarrow enjoyed walk \rightarrow walked
- For verbs that end in e, add only d. like \rightarrow liked love \rightarrow loved
- For verbs that end in a consonant + y, change the y to i and add -ed. $study \rightarrow studied$ $try \rightarrow tried$
- For most verbs that end in consonant + vowel + consonant, double the last consonant. $stop \rightarrow stopped$ plan \rightarrow planned


