### Notes

- We almost always use the contractions wasn't and weren't in speech and informal writing.
- Notice the past tense in sentences with there + be and it + be.

There were two restaurants in our hotel. It was sunny yesterday Was there a pool? Yes, there was. Was it fun? No, it wasn't.

### Was / wasn't and were / weren't

Was and were are usually unstressed when a stressed word (such as a noun or adjective) follows. Wasn't and weren't are always stressed. Notice: Wasn't has two syllables, but weren't has one syllable.



### Spelling rules for regular verbs

- For most verbs, add -ed to the base form. enjoy  $\rightarrow$  enjoyed walk  $\rightarrow$  walked
- For verbs that end in e, add only d. like  $\rightarrow$  liked love  $\rightarrow$  loved
- For verbs that end in a consonant + y, change the y to i and add -ed.  $study \rightarrow studied$   $try \rightarrow tried$
- For most verbs that end in consonant + vowel + consonant, double the last consonant. stop → stopped plan → planned
